

What is Black History/African American History Month and why do we celebrate it?

- Black/African American History Month is an annual month-long celebration in February,
 of achievements by Blacks or African Americans and a time for recognizing the central
 role of Blacks in U.S. history.
- Black History Month is aimed at educating and pays tribute to the generations of Blacks/African Americans who struggled with adversity to achieve full citizenship in American society.
- Black History Month brings awareness and education about historical **efforts by Blacks that helps to eradicate many racial stereotypes.** It focuses on history, family structure, social and economic pressures, stereotypes, and gender relationships.



Because he was a minister, writer and one of America's influential black leaders and founded the first black Methodist Episcopal Church in the US.






MAYA ANGELOU

"To be who you are and become what you are capable of is the only goal worth living."



W.E.B. DU BOIS


Because he was a sociologist, author and peace advocate for nuclear disarmament.

Because he was a composer, pianist and a pivotal figure in the history of jazz.




ARETHA FRANKLIN

Because he was the first black President of the United States of America.






JACKIE ROBINSON

JESSE OWENS


Because he set three world records and tied another, all in less than an hour, a feat that has never been repeated and went on to win 4 gold medals.
